Resurrection Weekend

What a great Easter weekend we had here in Sacile! On Sunday we had a combined service with the Africans, Americans and Italians. It was even more special than normal because my non-believing father-in-law came to an evangelical service for the first time in his life! We have invited him for...well every time he comes to visit but he has never committed to coming with us. His coming was icing on the cake for us. Following the service we had a massive potluck with all three congregations together! Monday in Italy is also a holiday and we

decided to have an outreach for Italians. The idea was to have around 30 Italians invited by our little Italian church. In the end we had around 75 in all, representing Italy, Ghana, Moldova, Romania, America and Bangladesh!! It was a great time to show the love of Christ through being the body of Christ. Josh translated for Rob (another missionary) as he shared thoughts about the risen Christ, and then Carmela translated in to English as Josh shared in Italian the wordless book, a children's message geared for the adults who were there.

Big Changes on the Horizon

We wrote in our last newsletter that we had been accepted by the mission Aurora and about our excitement in what the Lord had on the horizon for us with the mission. Well that horizon is just around the corner. The biggest change is a move from northeastern Italy to Sicily! That's right. We are heading to Acireale, in the province of Catania. We will be working with other Italian missionaries who are already on site. We have been working with the missionary here for the last 4 months phasing out of our position here and preparing for the move. We will move our household goods down to Sicily next month and put them in storage. We then head to the states for three months of support raising madness. Upon our return in September we will start finding a house and setting up for ministry there. As you can imagine this brings about a thousand prayer requests!

The first main obstacle is the move itself. Josh is having problems with his sciatic nerve and can't lift things. As if that isn't enough he has a surgery lined up for the 7th of May to fix his deviated septum. After the surgery, he will be in the hospital for 4 days then has to be in bed rest for at least 8 days, with no lifting for 8 more days! Basically that means that Josh can't do much at all.

The second obstacle is our stateside trip. We need to raise about 2000 dollars a month to get ourselves fully supported. In lieu of that we are trying to arrange as many speaking engagements as possible. Pray that the Lord opens doors for us to speak about what He is doing in Italy and in our lives. These are the two biggest hurdles on our plate at the moment. We could really use your prayers in these areas.
